

Reception:

The unit gives children an introduction to the French language. It includes some basic vocabulary, which will enable them to count up to 10 and introduce themselves in French. As well as talking about themselves, children will learn to introduce their immediate family in French. The unit ends with a simple story, which recaps some of the vocabulary from the unit as a whole.

New Language content

- * Greeting each other
- * Introducing themselves
- * Counting up to 10
- * Introducing their immediate family.

Autumn:

- **Recognise some basic French greetings.**

Children will have the opportunity to practice French greetings by singing along to cheerful songs. Children will be encouraged to include actions when they sing the songs.

As a class children will make a wall display using the different greetings learnt over the unit.

- **Respond to simple classroom instructions.**

Children will learn some simple classroom instructions like 'écoutez' (Listen) and 'répétez' (repeat). They will use these instructions in the class to ensure that all children are able to follow them.

Spring:

- **Recognise the numbers 1-10**

Children will be able to count to one to 10 in French. Children will later move on to answering a simple question of how old they are using the question: how old are you? And the response: I'm... years old.

- **Respond to simple questions with visual cues.**

Children will be able to express how they feel in French and will start to respond to simple questions such as:

How are you? Replying with: I'm...

Children will also begin to introduce themselves in French. Using the key question: what's your name and the response: My name is...

Summer:

- **Recognise basic family Vocabulary**

Children will be introduced to the French words for immediate family members such as: My mother, My father, My sister, My brother, My grandmother and my grandfather. ECT.

They will later ask and answer simple questions such as who is it? And here is...
