

SCIENCE

Pupils should be taught:

to identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense

Working Scientifically (KS1 WS)

- to observe and describe weather associated with the season and how day length varies.
- Identify, name and draw the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.
 - Seasonal change
 - My Body; label parts of the body

Work scientifically

- asking simple questions and recognising that they can be answered in different ways
- observing closely, using simple equipment
- performing simple tests
- identifying and classifying
- using their observations and ideas to suggest answers to questions
- gathering and recording data to help in answering questions.

Suggested Activities

- Look at photographs of everyone as babies, observing how babies change into adults
- Know that certain characteristics stay the same
- Look carefully at our bodies and collect data about head size, hand and foot size, hair and eye colour.
- Listen for sounds all around us - what can we hear with our ears?
- Explore different foods using different senses and classify into groups.
- Place different items (noisy, textured, smelly) in a feely bag and talk about how we know what those items are.
- Discuss what we know about all five senses.

ARTS

MUSIC

- Play tuned and un-tuned instruments musically. Listen with high concentration to a range of high live and recorded music.
- Experiment with, create, select and combine sounds.
 - Songs; chanting and Christmas songs for the performance.
 - Using musical instruments to produce a piece of music to describe rain/thunder storm to those who cannot see it so they can experience the season.

ART

- Pupils should be taught to use painting and drawing to develop ideas, experiences and imagination.
- To develop a wider range of art and design techniques in using colour, shape, form and line.
- Learn about the work of a range of artists and describe the similarities and differences.
 - Exploring the work of Michelangelo, Kandinsky and Klee (colour and shape).
 - Abstract pictures using wax crayons and watercolour paints to make resist paintings.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

- Show an awareness of how the body changes/functions during exercise.
 - Perform and repeat sequences of movements.
 - Development in fundamentals of movement i.e. jog, sprint, jump, hop, weight on hands, balance and co-ordination.
