



# Atherton Sacred Heart RC Primary School

## PE & Sport Grant Expenditure 2017-2018

**Estimated Funding: £8600**

The government has continued to provide £150 million of funding to primary schools for the 2017/18 academic year.

### Purpose of the Funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this. Possible uses for this funding are as follows:

- ✓ Staff Development: Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified coaches to work alongside teachers when delivering PE or Sports.
- ✓ New or additional sports clubs.
- ✓ Providing cover for teachers to access professional development in PE and Sport.
- ✓ Increased participation in sports outside of normal school time.
- ✓ Provide existing staff with resources to help them teach PE and Sport more effectively.
- ✓ Introduce new sports and activities that encourage more pupils to take up sport.
- ✓ Develop or add to the PE and sport activities that school already offers.

The table below details how we intend to spend our PE and Sports funding:

Extended Clubs/ Subsidised Activities	Develop further sporting opportunities after school which are delivered by school staff. Examples include Outdoor Games & African Dance. Funding used to subsidise these activities.	£1200	Increased participation in new sports/activities after school.
