

SCIENCE

Animals Including Humans – Our pets

Pupils should be taught to :

- i) identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals
- ii) identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores
- iii) describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals (fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals, including pets)

- Look carefully at the behaviour and habitats of creatures they find in the school grounds.
- Learn about a variety of common animals with a particular focus on the pets they keep and how they keep them happy and healthy.

Seasonal Changes

Pupils should be taught to:

- Understand and describe the main changes across the seasons.
- Understand weather associated with the seasons.
- Understand how day length varies across the year.

FRENCH

- Recognise the days of the week spoken in sequence
- Children will learn the days of the week in French.
 - This can be done through song.
- Children can also continue to answer simple questions such as what day is it?
 - Responding with it is...
- Understand most colours
- Children will also begin to learn a range of colours.
- Children will begin to answer the question:
 - What colour is it?
 - And respond with It's...

COMPUTING

Understand that ICT can be used to sort items and information. Understand that ICT can help us solve problems.

GROUPING AND SORTING

- To sort items using a range of criteria.
- To sort items on the computer using the 'Grouping' activities on Purple Mash.

MUSIC

- Play tuned and un-tuned instruments musically.
- Listen with high concentration to a range of high live and recorded music.
- Experiment with, create, select and combine sounds.
- Practise and perform songs for the Christmas Nativity performance.
- Songs, chanting and Christmas songs.

ART

- Pupils should be taught to use painting and drawing to develop ideas, experiences and imagination.
- To develop a wider range of art and design techniques in using colour, shape, form and line.
- Learn about the work of a range of artists and describe the similarities and differences.

- **Study of Lowry – Industrial Britain – create own matchstick scene.**
- **Weaving – textiles, paper, ribbon and fabric.**

HUMANITIES

Pupils should be taught about the lives of significant historical events, people and places in their own locality.

- Remembering the soldiers who died for us during the World Wars and making a poppy to remember.
- Industrial Atherton looking at maps in the 1900s and now to compare. What has changed and what has stayed the same?
- Examining Atherton's past in the cotton industry. Visit from a cotton mill worker. Enamill cotton mill link.
- Learning about working in mills in Victorian times and about lives of mill workers in 1900 Lancashire.
- Examining the lives of significant individuals who have contributed to local developments
 - Lowry - his life and contribution to art in Britain.
 - George Stevenson – locomotives.
 - The Wright Brothers – aeroplanes.
 - Queen Victoria.
 - Prince Albert – brought the first Christmas tree to England.
- Children to make a Christingle.

Role-play:

- Victorian Christmas scene.
- Weaving in a mill.

- Show an awareness of how the body changes and functions during exercise.
- Develop children's abilities to exercise at different intensities.
- Show an awareness of change in heart rate during exercise.
